2021 Virtual Foundations of Faith Community Nursing Course

Duet is proud to present the Foundations of Faith Community Nursing Course. This educational experience is open to all registered nurses with active licenses.

What is Faith Community Nursing?

Faith Community Nursing is a specialized practice of professional nursing that focuses on the intentional care of the spirit as part of the process of promotion of whole person health and the prevention or minimization of illness within the context of a faith community and the wider community (groups, families, persons). (1) This practice is guided by the following general principles:

- Effective healthcare requires more than medical treatment of disease or illness.
- Promotion of health and healing are part of the mission and service of a faith community to its members.
- Wellness and wholeness of persons across the lifespan can only fully be achieved when we acknowledge the close connection between body, mind and spirit.



This course is based on the curriculum developed through the Westberg Institute for Faith Community Nursing, a ministry of Church Health Center, 420 North Cleveland Ave, Memphis, TN 38104. Duet has been approved to offer the standardized curriculum.

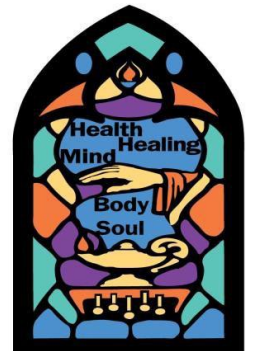

Enrollment Requirements

- Be a registered nurse with an active license.
- Have completed spiritual assessment upon registration for the course.
- Must have capability of participating in virtual environment via ZOOM Platform

Format

- Foundations course work uses a hybrid format consisting of community assignments that complement class time.
- The course presents comprehensive instruction over 5.5 class days: three in September and 2.5 in October.

Faculty

- This course will be taught by experienced faith community nurses as well as various content area experts from the greater Phoenix area.

Continuing Education

- This continuing nursing education activity was approved by the Western Multi-State Division, an accredited approver by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation.
